## “Too Much – Too Little”

**2 Corinthians 8:7-15**



June 27 — 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost

Sermon Title: “Too Much, Too Little”

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

There’s a song by Deniece Williams and Johnny Mathis that may have been inspired by Paul in our text today. “Too Much, Too Little, Too Late.” Now Paul isn’t really writing a breakup song to the Corinthians, but we saw last week that Paul does NOT feel the Corinthian church was meeting him halfway. So, what does Paul hearken back to in the text today? The Exodus! In the wilderness God gave them manna to eat (not what they wanted, but it did sustain them). As long as they collected what they could eat (not hoard) that day (give us our daily bread), there was never too much or too little. The point was trusting God to have it there again the next day. Some did not trust, and they discovered their hoarding left them nothing but garbage the next day. Paul is not only asking Corinth to trust God, Paul is asking them to share in community with other churches. How does this work in a modern society? How is it some have **too much** while others have **too little**? We had best face this Christian challenge before it’s **too late**! And there’s that song again! HA....
