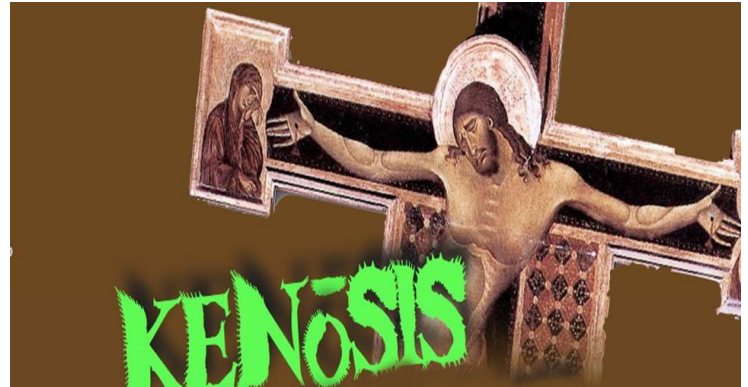

Philippians 2:5-11

October 17 — 21st Sunday after Pentecost
in Kingdomtide
Sermon Title: "Kenosis"

Scripture: Philippians 2:5-11 (includes 3:4-10)

Kenosis is a weird concept from Philippians 2:7 that Charles Wesley used in his great hymn *And Can It Be That I Should Gain?* Here Charles said that Jesus — come to earth — had to "empty himself of all but love." The "self-limitation" of God in Jesus begs the question: "If we are imitators of Christ, how are we to be emptied of self?" What does that process look like? We are copycats of Paul now when we declare with him "I want to know Christ." He speaks about his many achievements as a Roman citizen and a Pharisee, but counts all this as _____ compared to knowing Christ.
