July 30—One Service "Pop Quiz" - Romans 8: 28-39

One of the things I love about Wesleyan Theology is the doctrine of free will in our lives. The choice to accept or deny Christ is our decision, and our decision alone. Heaven or hell have not been chosen for us and as long as we have breath, we can accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

In our passage for Sunday, Romans 8:28 says, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." This verse is often used by others to show that God will cause both the good and bad of all situations to accomplish God's will.

Wesleyan theology does not support that belief and many other Scriptures don't either. A God who loves the world so much would not cause tragic events to anyone for God's Will to be accomplished. God's love would never harm or kill God's children in order to punish us or grieve us. God's Will for us is about loving God with all of our being and loving our neighbor in the same we would want to be loved.

The Apostle Paul asked the church in Rome some 2,000 years ago this very question, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?" For the balance of our reading, Paul tells the Roman church then and us today that there is nothing in this world or this universe that can keep us from our loving Heavenly Father. And "nothing" means no thing, no person, no theology will be able to keep us from the Agape Love of God which is found in the life, death, and resurrection of God's Son and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.




CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING
