August 6—Holy Communion "Not Your Ordinary Miracle" - Matthew 14: 13-21

You may notice in our reading for this Sunday that there are some unanswered questions. Like what had happened to cause Jesus to get into a boat all by himself? If you notice in the prior verses of Matthew 14, you will see that King Herod had killed Jesus' cousin, John the Baptist. This surely would have caused Jesus to grieve the loss of his cousin and want to be alone.

Another question might be, why didn't the large crowds go on their own to find food for themselves when it was later in the day? Because Jesus had something to teach the disciples. They tried to get Jesus to send the people off to the nearby villages for food, but Jesus told the disciples to find some food to feed the people.

The disciples come back later and say that they only had 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish. Jesus told them to bring the food to him. After he had blessed the bread and the fish, Jesus had the people sit down. He then gave the meal to the disciples, who then passed it onto the crowd.

After the crowd had their fill of the meal, the disciples went around and picked twelve baskets of bread and fish. Now our reading is usually called the feeding of 5,000 but according to verse 20, that number was for the 5,000 men who were there. This brings along another question. Who knows how many women and children there were also? Counting both the women and children, some theologians estimate the crowd as high as 12,000 people total. How in the world did Jesus feed all of those people? Believe it or not, that's the wrong question. The right question is why would Jesus feed all of those people? Because he loved them and had compassion for them. The same reasons he had when Jesus went to the cross for them and for everyone else who have placed their faith in him, including us.
