August 20 "A Mothers' Love" - Matthew 15: 21-28

Have you ever wondered why the New Testament almost always shows the best side of Jesus? Just last week Jesus was shown walking on the water and then saving Peter from drowning after he looked at the storm instead of Jesus. The week before that Jesus was healing all of the sick people brought to him and then went on to feed about 10-12 thousand people with five barley loaves and a couple of fish.

Are there any passages where Jesus is not behaving and doing the right thing? Well, this Sunday we are going to looking at a time where it appears Jesus wasn't on his best behavior. It appeared that Jesus was intentionally ignoring a Canaanite mother who wanted Jesus to heal her daughter of demon possession. When Jesus finally does say something to the woman, he told her that he was only supposed to reach out to *"the lost sheep of Israel."*

The woman then came to Jesus and knelt before him and pleaded for Jesus' help. Instead of offering his help, he more or less called the woman and her people a dog. He told her, *"It is not right to take the children's bread and toss it to the dogs."* Hearing that, the Canaanite woman reminded Jesus that even the dogs got to eat the scraps which fell from their masters' table.

Well, Jesus must have liked the mother's response because he told that her great faith would lead to her daughter's healing. Now why didn't Jesus simply do this in the first place instead of having the woman go through all she had to do for her daughter's healing? Maybe, just maybe, Jesus knew what the woman was willing to do for her daughter. Maybe Jesus was trying to show the disciples that day and maybe even us today of our need to offer our ministries to everyone. *Loving our neighbor means loving everyone!* Even to those that the world around us may consider to be dogs.
