THE PARABLE OF THE VINEYARD THE WAGES OF LIFE AND WORK IN GOD'S KINGDOM

September 24 "Definition of Fair" Matthew 20: 1-16

This Sunday morning, you may hear a familiar parable about the kingdom of heaven. It is the story about a vineyard and an owner. The owner got up early one morning in search of workers to work his vineyard. The owner found several workers in a nearby marketplace and agreed to pay them a denarius (a Roman coin) if they would work all day in his vineyard.

Later that morning, he went back and hired several more workers telling them he would pay them "whatever is right" for their work at the end of the day. The owner ended up going back to the marketplace three more times hiring workers to work in his vineyard.

At the end of the day, the owner called the foreman to pay each of the workers starting with those who were hired last and on up to those hired first. The foreman paid the last workers a denarius. The foreman then continued to pay the workers a denarius up through the workers who had worked all day.

The workers who had worked all day were angry toward the owner of the vineyard. They wanted more pay than the rest because they had worked longer and harder than those who came later to work. Yet, they had all agreed to work all day for a denarius.

Since this is a parable, the main character of any parable is usually seen as God. So, if that is true, is God being fair to those who worked the longest part of the day?

I hope to see you on Sunday morning as we look for a possible answer to this last question.
