


Bascomb Preschool Scholastic Book Fair

October 22—Stewardship Campaign 2024 "Investing With Your Talents" Matthew 2: 12-18

This coming Sunday, we will be looking at a passage of Scripture that is usually not heard in the Month of October. It's usually heard the first Sunday of January, which is when we celebrate Epiphany Sunday. The passage I am referring to is where the Wisemen/Magi/Kings come to visit the infant Jesus and his earthly parents at a house where they are staying.

Once inside, the Magi bowed down and worshipped the baby king, the one they believed to be the future King of the Jews. They then presented their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Afterwards, the Magi were warned to go a different way home in order to avoid Herod, while that same night Joseph was warned by an angel to take the child and Mary and head to Egypt.

I wonder what ever happened to those gifts given to Jesus from the Magi. The Scriptures never tell us whatever happened to them. Besides what would a small child do with *gold, frankincense, and myrrh?*

Question for you, have you ever offered anything to Jesus? Maybe not what the Magi gave him, but maybe something of worth? Maybe a gift that only you could give Jesus? Maybe a gift that Jesus could use for the kingdom of God? A gift that Jesus could use for his church here at Bascomb?

We're now in our third week of Stewardship sermons. Last week, I shared a sermon called "Investing with Your Time" where we can give of our time to our church serving others in a variety of ways such as helping with our children and our youth. This week, I will share how we can help Bascomb by "investing" with our talents and our gifts. We will hear from a couple of members via video who will share how they serve Bascomb with their talents so that we and others may thank God for such a place like Bascomb.
