

December 10, 2023—2nd Sunday of Advent "Remembrance of Christmas Past" Isaiah 9:2, 6 / Hebrews 11:1

How many pictures do you have from your life or the lives of loved ones? Over the years, I believe that between Brenda and I we have about 3 to 4,000 pictures. Now that's physical pictures either in bundles or in photo albums. I also have, according to my phone, another 2460 photos and 50 videos on my cell phone. And if you count the 5200 pictures that are on Brenda's cell phone, we have over 12,000.

That's a lot of pictures for US to have! About 12,000 pictures! 12,000 pictures of people and/or things from our past. Now before June 13, 2020, we probably had less than 9,000 pictures. So, what happened on June 13th 2020, to cause such a large jump of photographical evidence of our past? Simple, our first and only grandchild, *Rowan Grace Dixon* was born. Mine and Brenda's cell phone are loaded with Rowan pictures. She is indeed a part of our past and will continue to be for many, many years to come.

This coming Sunday, I will continue our sermon series which is based on the book based on the Charles Dickens classic, "A Christmas Carol." Last Sunday, we went over a brief introduction to the main character of the book, Ebeneezer Scrooge. We're told in the book that Scrooge was a major grumpy person with little personal skills to say otherwise.
