January 7, 2024—Epiphany Sunday "Wise Things" Matthew 2: 1-12

What does it mean to be truly wise? Well, the next question should be "wise" about what? TV shows often show good cops as the ones who are "street-wise." To be wise in the ways of life would sometimes involve "life experiences" such as travel, studies, and many different types of relationships.

Then there is something from the Bible that describes being wise. Proverbs 9:10 says that being afraid of God is the beginning of wisdom. Now I'm pretty sure that we are NOT to be actually afraid for our life from God. This would be counter to what John 3:16 saying how "God so loved the world..."

In our Scripture reading for this Sunday, which is also Epiphany Sunday, we have some gentlemen traveling from a great distance in the East to come and visit the one who "was born to be the "King of the Jews." Over the centuries, these gentlemen have been called a variety of names— Magi, astrologers, kings, and wise men.

So, what made the gentlemen to be called wisemen? If you read Matthew 2:1-12, you may see several things taking place in the passage that pointed to the wisdom of these gentlemen. This is especially true in how they arrived in our Bibles and in how they welcomed the baby Jesus as the one who indeed was born to be the King of the Jews.
