April 14, 2024—Nick Yother Preaching Matthew 14: 22-33 "Are WE supposed to walk on water?"

I'm excited to get the opportunity to be with you all this Sunday. As a youth minister and having my degree in early childhood education you never know exactly how my preaching will turn out. Will it be purely educational? Will there be a super soaker used in part of the sermon? (there won't be... probably). Guess you will have to come and find out.

I've heard quite a few sermons about Peter walking on water that basically comes down to everyone giving Peter praise for the faith he shows by stepping out of the boat and walking on water. The Problem, as it is usually put, is that he takes his eyes off Jesus, and his faith falters, but Jesus is there to save him. So those sermons conclude with statements like... be courageous, get out of the boat, but keep your focus on Jesus.

Okay, those messages are good encouragement for some people to put their faith into action, but does it miss the point of the story? We tend to focus on Peter as the hero in this story making crazy steps in faith. But if he were the hero, then why did Jesus tell him he had little faith? Was Jesus being hard on him?
